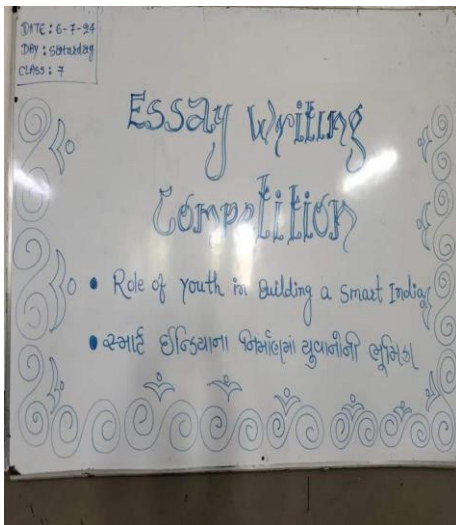


TCS Essay Writing
