


#### From The Principal's Desk

#### **School Activities**

Coloring is a classic and favorite pastime for children, but it is also a simple activity that helps children to develop cognitively, psychologically, and creatively. It sparks their imagination and gives children an opportunity to express themselves. The children enjoyed the activity very much.





#### **Hand on Experiments**

A classic school science experiment to demonstrate the concept of density involves layering liquids of different densities in a clear glass. Gather liquids like honey, dish soap, water, oil, and rubbing alcohol. Carefully pour each liquid into the glass, starting with the densest (honey) and moving to the least dense (alcohol). Pour slowly to avoid mixing. You'll observe distinct layers forming, as each liquid has a different density. For added fun, drop small objects like a grape, a paperclip, or a piece of plastic into the glass and watch them settle in different layers based on their own densities.

### Visits



#### Vikram Sarabhai Space Center

Students from classes 6, 7, and 8 visited the Vikram Sarabhai Science Community Centre for an educational experience that included sessions on astronomy and mathematics. In the astronomy session, students learned about refraction, the visibility of stars, and the significance of the Dhruv star in indicating the north direction. They explored the parts of a periscope, how to construct a telescope, and how plane mirrors reflect light in telescopes. They also engaged in asking space-related questions, such as how black holes are formed, with the explanation focusing on supernovae. In the mathematics session, students were introduced to puzzles, games, and working models, starting with India's first mathematics lab, established in 1974. They learned about the Pythagoras theorem and actively participated in solving puzzles related to congruence, symmetry, and properties of shapes. Challenges included arranging numbers without consecutive neighbors and drawing hexagons while maintaining similar conditions. The visit provided an engaging and hands-on learning experience for all participants.
